



As you enter in silence please reflect on this passage from Isaiah 58:6-9 (The Message translation)

"This is the kind of fast day I'm after:

LITANY OF PENITENCE

The prophets remind us that our prayer, fasting and pious ritual must be lived out in compassion and justice:

When we forget the fast you desire -

To do justice, and stand up for the powerless:

Lord, have mercy.

When we forget the prayer you love -

To show compassion, and care for those in need:

Christ, have mercy.

When we forget the rituals you require -

To create relationships of righteousness and peace:

Lord have mercy.

At the very beginning,

God scooped up the dust of the earth and molded it into human beings,

breathing divine breath into those creatures of dust.

Over time though, we dust creatures have forgotten who we are and whose we are.

We believed a serpent in the Garden of Eden who said we could become like God.

We believed that Aaron's golden calf could guide us in the wilderness.

We believed like the builders of Babel who thought by our own hands we could be greater than God.

We believed we knew better than God where God's Word was needed.

We have covered up with leaves and clothes.

We stopped taking time to walk with God in the gardens of the world God created.

We have been prone to wander.

But God does not stop finding ways to meet us.

God spoke through a burning bush, a whisper, a cloud pillar, a giant fish, the laws given to Moses, and then ultimately through Jesus Christ.

By living a perfect sinless life,

Jesus exposed our lies of self-sufficiency.

Our sinful pride is brought into the light.

Our dusty nature is right there on the surface.

Let us reclaim the dust with which we were formed.

Let us recognize our need for the God who created us

and for the Savior who desires to wash all of God's children clean.

new stars, new dust, new life;

take my heart,

every hardened edge and measured beat,

and create something new in me.

Lead and guide us on this Lenten journey...send us out into this world that we may walk with Jesus toward the hill of Golgotha and like him take up our cross and follow, for that is the faithful way.

*IMPOSITION OF ASHES

Ashes serve as a sign of human mortality and penitence and as a reminder that only by God's grace are we given eternal life Ashes are imposed with the words of Genesis 3:19:

"Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

Those who wish to receive the sign of the cross are invited to come forward by the center aisle and then return on the side aisle.
