
GARDEN PLANTING

- 30 Big Boy Tomato plants
- Blue Lake Pole Beans to run up the fence in raised beds around perimeter
- Cucumbers with a wire cage on top to let the cucumbers run up.
- Yellow Squash in the raised beds
- Zucchini in the garden ground space




HOLOCAUST REMEMBRANCE SERVICE
